RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Juniors must be in high school and not exceed 18 years of age.
2. Exhibitor fee is \$2.00. Each Exhibitor may show no more than one entry per section.
3. Anything to be shown in the palace must be in by 12:30 pm on Friday or be locked out
4. No article may be removed from the grounds before 3:30pm on Sunday
5. Do not wash or peel vegetables: brush off loose dirt and display on disposable plates.
6. Juniors who wish to enter in Adult Classes must pay the Adult Exhibitor fee as well.

Prize money may be picked up at the Secretary booth on Saturday afternoon or Sunday.

PRIZES: First \$4.00, Second \$3.00, Third \$2.50

A Trophy is donated by the Royal Bank, Odessa, for the most prize money won in the Junior Section.

Chocolate Chip Cookies Competition Rules (no nuts)

1. Contest is open to Youth up to 15 years (as of Dec 31 of current year.)
2. Winner of the Chocolate Chip Cookies Class at the local Fair/Exhibition is eligible to enter the District Competition.
3. One entry per Agricultural Society.
4. Must be solely made by class winner.

District Competition

5. The winner from each Fair/Exhibition will be eligible to enter at the District Competition.
6. District entry must consist of 8 cookies displayed on a firm, disposable plate.
7. Plain chocolate chip cookies, with no nuts, must be no larger than 3" (6.75cm) and no smaller than 2" (5 cm)
8. Prize money to be paid by the District.

Provincial Competition

9. The entrant must be the winner from the District Competition.
10. In cases where the District winner is unable to send an entry to the convention, then the 2nd place District winner will be eligible to enter.
11. The entry for the District must consist of 8 cookies displayed on a plate provided by the O.A.A.S. Chocolate Chip Cookie Committee.
12. Plain chocolate chip cookies, with no nuts, are to be no larger than 3" (6.75cm) and no smaller than 2" (5cm).
13. The entry must be tagged with the exhibitor's name, address and District represented using the entry tag provided.
14. Cookies will be judged according to the O.A.A.S. Homecraft Judging Standards.
15. Entries will be received at the Convention according to the convention schedule. Judging will commence at 9:00am to 9:30am.

Provincial Poster Competition Rules

1. Winner of the Poster Competition class at the local Fair/Exhibition is eligible to enter the District Competition. District winners are eligible to enter at the provincial competition.
2. One entry per Agricultural Society.
3. Must be hand drawn.
4. Theme: "Promoting Your Fair" Name and date of fair must be clearly shown on poster.
5. Poster Size (without border): Minimum – 22 cm x 28 cm
Maximum – 28 cm x 44 cm
6. Three classes: A) Junior, up to and including grade 4 B) Intermediate, grade 5 to grade 8 inclusive
C) Senior, grade 9 to grade 12 inclusive
7. Each entry must be centered on or **BRISTOL BOARD** exposing a 5.5 cm border **CARD STOCK** on all four sides.
8. Limited to ONE entry per class per DISTRICT. Each district to hold a competition prior to the annual convention.
9. Name of fair, district no., contact person, owner of poster and complete mailing address must be clearly labelled on the back of each entry.
10. Entries will be received in the Ball Room on Friday morning of the convention 7:30 to 8:30 am. Judging to commence at 9:00 am. Posters must be picked up between 5:00 pm and 5:30 pm on Friday evening.

Note: Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies will not be responsible for lost items.
